Upon checking our bookmobile route, I find that we could make our first stop at your library on Thursday, November thirtieth, at ten A. M. Will you let us know whether this will be satisfactory? If you find that there are too many gaps on your shelves after doing so, we could tide you over for a few months by a supplementary loan of older books from our collection at De Kalb. If we have any reference material available, it should give you an opportunity to see the type of information available in these more expensive volumes, even though they might not be the current edition. You would then have an opportunity to judge whether they would be what you require for first purchase.

You have a fine, enthusiastic board and I enjoyed meeting all of you. I was so sorry that I did not realize that you were not going to be with us for that wonderful pumpkin pie. The lady who has the real estate office next door (Mrs. Loebe?) gave me a huge Tribune map of Chicago. Will you tell her for me that it really worked, for we routed ourselves to the Museum of Science and Industry by it and arrived right at the door without a single error. It is our most cherished possession.
